

Arkansas operates on a biennial budget cycle with annual appropriations. In odd numbered years, the General Assembly meets for a regular session to consider all bills. In even numbered years, budget hearings are held for the Department of Education, Institutions of Higher Education, Department of Health, Department of Human Services, Department of Corrections, Department of Public Safety, and any additional agencies that may be referred by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. Non-appropration bills may be introduced if both chambers pass a resolution with 2/3 vote to introduce other legislation.

Feb '20: President submits budget request on the first Monday



Feb-Apr '20: Congress reviews president's budget request and holds budget hearings with agency officials



May-Jul '20: House and Senate draft and approve appropriations



Aug-Sep '20: House and Senate finalize bicameral appropriations legislation



Sep '20: President signs the legislation into law by Sept. 31, 2020
