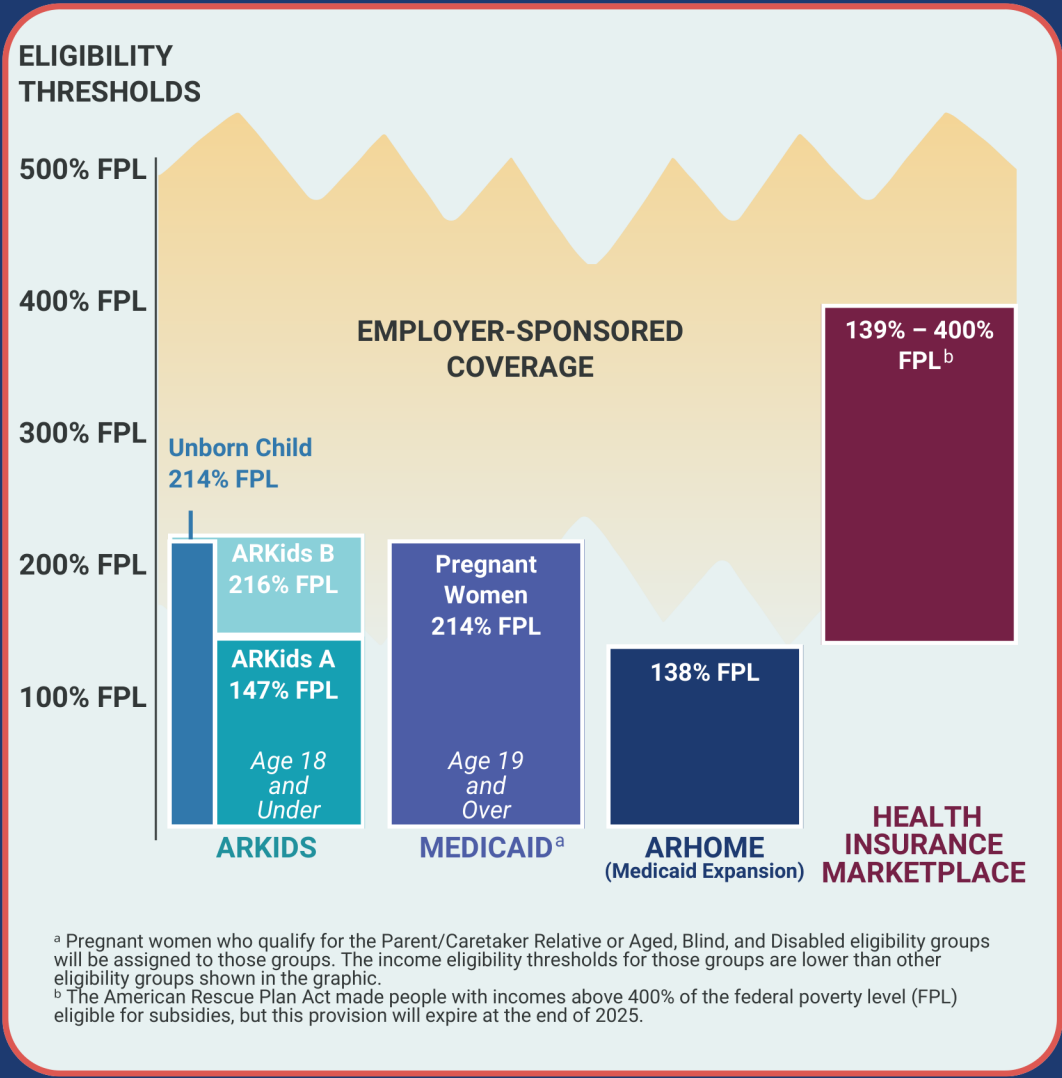


PREGNANCY COVERAGE IN ARKANSAS



This graphic shows the primary sources of health insurance coverage for pregnant women in Arkansas. ARKids First, for ages up to 19, includes ARKids A for those who qualify for Medicaid coverage and ARKids B (Children’s Health Insurance Program, or CHIP) for those earning too much for Medicaid. CHIP funds can also cover unborn children of pregnant immigrant women through the “unborn child” option. The Arkansas Health and Opportunity for Me (ARHOME) program is available to adults earning up to 138% of the federal poverty level (FPL). Marketplace enrollees may be eligible for subsidies with a scaled contribution based on income. Employer-sponsored coverage is not dependent on FPL, but it is illustrated here as a source of coverage for many Arkansas residents.
